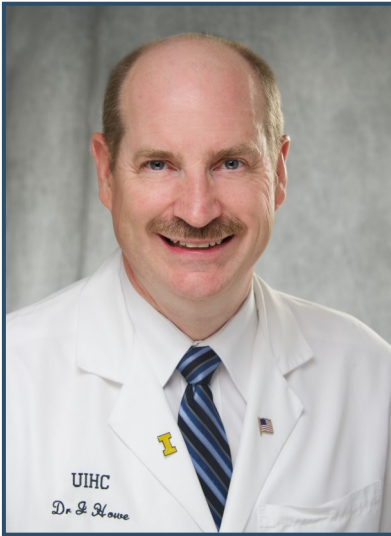

Professor of Surgery

Director, Surgical Oncology and Endocrine Surgery

Roy J. and Lucille A. Carver University of Iowa College of Medicine



Dr. Howe serves as Professor of Surgery, Division Director of Surgical Oncology, and Endocrine Surgery in the Department of Surgery at the University of Iowa. He did his General Surgical Residency and Surgical Oncology Research Fellowship at Washington University and Surgical Oncology fellowship at Memorial Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center. He began his career at the University of Iowa in 1996. His basic science research is dedicated to understanding

the molecular genetic basis of familial cancer syndromes, and on gene expression patterns of neuroendocrine tumors (NETs). He is currently funded by the NIH through the Iowa SPORE grant. His clinical practice is in General Surgical Oncology and Endocrine Surgery with special emphasis on small bowel NETs, pancreatic NETs, and cytoreduction of liver metastases. He is currently the Past President of the North American Neuroendocrine Tumor Society (NANETS) and Past President of the Society of Surgical Oncology. He has written numerous clinical and basic science articles on the subject of NETs and organized recent NANETS consensus guideline meetings devoted to the surgical management of small bowel and pancreatic NETs.
